- State changed pension rules for Public Safety Employees to increase pension amount
- Council has no formal position on Inland Port lawsuit. Will continue to work with leg on current negotiated items
- Watershed bills this session were not damaging to the existing and future protections of the watershed.

7:40 Open Discussion – Off-leash Enforcement in WH Park & Preserve

- One issue is that there is currently no city code to enforce on leash in designated “preserve” areas

- Playground area is **never** an off leash area
- Suggestion that we get temporary enhanced enforcement of off leash hours from SL Co Animal Services
- Current enforcement efforts are driven by complaints

8:03 Salt Lake City Public Utilities – Present preliminary plans for a storm drain improvement project in area surrounding 1700 South and 2100 East.

- The goal of this project is to collect storm water runoff north of 1700 S and west of Foothill Drive and convey it to Emigration Creek above the outlet works for Wasatch Hollow Park.
