- Present upcoming micro-transit program starting later this year. The concept is to partner with a Transportation Network Company (Lyft, Uber, etc.) to provide on-demand first mile/last mile connections to transit.
 - Fully subsidized trips from front door to transit stop
 - Interzonal trips cost regular transit fare
 - Goal is to launch the service by August 12th
