- Crime Report
 - There was a fairly serious crime last month when a car prowler escalated into an aggravated burglary. There was some citizen involvement that may have escalated the situation. A family was held at knifepoint, ultimately no one was harmed.
 - Working to streamline bicycle registration process. Goal is to centralize serial numbers on file with SLCPD to allow better recovery of stolen bikes.

- City Council Report
 - EM - Provided email sign up list and discussed content of her newsletter
 - EM discussed her interest in using data analysis to better predict what's happening in a neighborhood. Also use as a baseline benchmark for areas that are going to have HRC's located in them.
 - CL – Discussed new library funding. Next public hearing regarding increasing the library bond is at city/county building on June 6th. If you can't make it, share your concerns with Mr. Luke or Ms. Mendenhall.

- CL – Discussed water rate increase. Water increase is for infrastructure improvements.
- EM – Discussed sewer rate increase. EPA requirements are driving system adjustments. Meeting those requirements will require new construction.

 - Question regarding street repair funding. Actual cost to bring streets up to par, is \$36 million. Only \$11 million in the budget. Can't bond for maintenance. Looking at different options to fund road maintenance.
