7:00 Michael Dodd - WHCC Chair

- Welcome
- Approval of minutes from last meeting - Approved

7:03 SLCFD Station 10

- Current fire chief is retiring, city is in process of looking for new chief
- Thanked them for participation in HollowFest
- Discussed hiring diversification effort
- Seems to be an increase in fires over the past couple of months
- Question regarding disposing of old American flags. They can assist. Bring the flag to the station.
- Question regarding combined dispatch system implementation timing. 18 months is target date.

7:10 Moana Uluave-Hafoka – Mayor’s Office Community Liaison, District 6

- Mayor’s Office Report - Mayor’s office is fairly firm on 250 bed homeless facilities due to time constraints.
- ACE Fund application workshop Saturday from 11 – 1 at Sorensen Unity Center
- Introduced Carol (District 6 Enforcement Officer) – takes complaints on weeds, junk cars, unkempt rentals, etc. Left flyers, including HAB Board. Looking for volunteers.
- Complaints to enforcement are handled anonymously. Carol is the only one that sees any personal information.
- Answer questions from WHCC members
- Question regarding street signage that is being ignored on Emerson. Mike Berry was given as a contact.
- Question regarding water bills and where the money is going. Charlie Luke answered the question regarding public process and timing of notice.
- Long discussion on the shelter process, who has been involved and the tension between the council and the mayor’s office. Moana offered to take anyone interested on a tour of local homeless facilities.

7:30 Detective Josh Smith – Community Intelligence Unit, District 6

- Thanks to Det. Smith for attending HollowFest.

- Crime Report – continue to see random burglaries and car prowls. Increase in loud parties (3 or more people causing a disturbance). There is no time restriction, any disturbance is against the ordinance. Call the non-emergency number to report.

7:42 Charlie Luke – City Councilmember, District 6

- Question regarding the status of Wasatch Hollow off leash pilot program and timing of when the council will address it. Charlie will follow up with council staff.
- Discussed where the council deviates from the mayor’s office in regards to the size and location of the new homeless shelters. Council would like a cap of 150 beds. Council would like completely segregated facilities available by gender and one for couples/families.
- Question regarding the legislature’s reluctance to fund multiple facilities. Noted that discussions with the legislature have not indicated this is an issue.
- Question regarding how 1200 people go into 500 beds. The city is committed to 500 beds. The county will fill the gap.
- County wants the city to repurpose an existing building into temporary emergency shelter while the new shelters are built.
- Council is looking at using RDA funds to build affordable housing.

8:15 Brian Tonetti – Seven Canyons Trust Director Executive Director

- Discuss Daylighting and Rehabilitating the Seven Canyon Creeks. Potential of daylighting Emigration Creek where it goes underground as it exits Wasatch Hollow Park towards 1700 S.
- Question regarding potential daylighting the south end of City Creek. Potential exists for part of the creek.
- Question regarding daylighting Red Butte under Foothill. No real progress to report.

8:30 Community Events & Issues – Michael Dodd, Chair

- Wasatch Hollow Preserve – Construction Update
  - 1) Bridge Railing: Crews started construction of the railing last week. The railing should be completed this week.
  - 2) Benches: Timber benches will be delivered and installed on site this week.
  - 3) Fencing: The sub-contractor has ordered materials and plans to start construction as soon as they are delivered, which could be 2-3 weeks from today.
  - 4) Boardwalk: We are making slight modifications to the design to accommodate for our recent soil analysis that was conducted. Work should begin in the next few weeks.
  - 5) The fencing on the Park boundary has been removed so folks can access the southern trails within the preserve. We have placed fencing “prohibiting” access into the wetland meadow and across the bridge. I understand the traffic has increased significantly. If you could please share with the council that construction is still on-going so please respect the fencing and closed areas. We are also working to

produce the trail signage to help educate folks on the dog/pedestrian/bike areas.

We hope to have signage placed as soon as the permanent fencing is installed.

- Trial Off Leash in Wasatch Hollow Park –The ball is in the City Council’s court
- First Annual HollowFest – A Great Success
- Several comments regarding dogs and people accessing the new Open Space area. The area is not officially open. Dogs are not allowed in the open space. Bicycles are not allowed in the Open Space area. Fencing will be installed to delineate the appropriate areas for bikes and dogs.
- Comment that city will prune trees on the street if you call the city arborist.
