  - Reminder that dispersed homeless are allowed in public spaces, trespassing should be reported. SLC Mobile is a good tool for geolocating reports of trespasses.

  - Question regarding what’s enforceable on park strips. Depends on where it is, but in general trespassing laws can be enforced there.
